(PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND APPLIED ARTS)

OBJECTIVES:

India has a glorious past history regarding to Art, Philosophy, Yoga, Music & many other Mundane Science. Admired and extolled by many, but equally misunderstood and divided by some others, are the Culture, Religion & Arts and Traditions of the homeland of Aryans i.e., Bhartiyas. All paeans of praise seem to fail short of the true measure of the incomparable greatness & indescribable grandeur of this celestial land.

The Literature & Authentic documents relating to art of ancient India must be studied in original by the student of Fine Arts. These documents are in the Sanskrit Language & hence, the necessity to learn Sanskrit at least to understand the spirit by themselves.

Bachelor of Fine Arts course has its objective, the preparation of artists with individuality, originality and resourcefulness in the field of their choice. It will be presumed that the fine arts Students who are accepted for Bachelor of Fine Arts course have to develop a personal approach to the problems of art. The actual teaching programme may be drawn up by the teacher(s) concerned within the suggested course-structure, aiming at a high degree of professional competence and creative excellence. Exploration of the maximum possibilities of material(s) of local environment, of sources of external interest, of social and contemporary relevance in terms of techniques and ideas with an aesthetic insight will be the main directions of thrust.

SYLLABUS FOR BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS PAINTING, SCULPTURE AND APPLIED ART (8 Semesters Degree Course in the Faculty of Fine Arts)

(Effective from the 2012-13 academic sessions)

1. The Bachelor of Fine Arts course shall be of Four Years duration with Eight Semesters in any one of the Streams in fine art discipline of Painting, Sculpture & Applied Art.
2. Eligibility for Admission to the B.F.A. First Semester Course is 10+2 or its Equivalent as per the Norms of the University. The Duration of B. F. A. course is 8 Semesters, i.e., First & Second Semester (Common to all Students) + 6 Semesters of Specialisation in Painting / Sculpture / Applied Arts. A candidate with 10+2 qualification with 1 Year of formal art education from recognised University / Institute can be admitted to 3rd Semester, i.e. Direct Admission to Specialisation.
3. The medium of Instruction will be English / Marathi / Hindi or Sanskrit. The question papers will be set in English & Marathi. The Candidates may answer in any one of the above four languages.
4. The course is designed for practicing artists and hence greater weightage would be given to practical courses. The Theory courses are considered as subsidiary courses. Practical papers will have 200 Marks each and the theory papers will have 100 Marks each.
5. It is obligatory for Student to pass in all the subjects in both the heads:

Practical:	Term Work -	40%
	Examination -	60%
Theory:	Tutorials -	40%
	Examination -	60%

To be promoted to the higher class. However the Student can get the ATKT consideration as per the University rules. The minimum passing percentages will 40% in both the heads. 45% of marks will be considered as 2nd Class. 60% as 1st class & 75% as distinction. It is not necessary to score the percentage in both the heads. The class will be decided on basis of aggregate marks.

6. Dissertation on the material technique and aesthetic of candidate will be on his / her own expression or any other subject approved by guide or H.O.D. Audio Visual Pattern or concise hand copy will also be accepted.
7. Internal submissions will be twice in a semester.
8. Subject to fulfilment of the condition for promotion from Semester to Semester of Bachelor of Fine Arts course in practical streams shall be strictly guided by the following factors:
 - a) Minimum 75% of attendance separately in theoretical and practical classes.
 - b) Fulfilment of assignments and active involvement.
9. Evaluation of the practical works shall be under taken by a panel of artists and artist historians to be recommended by the respective Board of Studies where one or more external examiners of repute shall be included. The panel examiners shall consist of equal number of Internal and External members.
10. A student who either fails in the examination or fails to sit for his/her final Master of Fine Art examination after attending full course and qualifying in the internal assessment may be provided studio facility for another session only to enable him/her to appear in the final examination of the next as a regular students on payment of the usual charges.
11. Provided again that if he/she either fails in the examination or fails to appear in the examination for the second consecutive chance he/she may avail of the chances provided in the relevant ordinance as are ex-student candidate only, without provision for Studio facilities.
12. Examination will be conducted towards the end of the Semester by the University. The Board will consist of a two members Jury of Internal Examiners for assessment of the term work & the same will be supplemented with an external examiner at the time of annual examination.
13. The Question papers in theory examination will offer option for every unit. There will be two questions on each unit and the student will attempt any one of the two.
14. It is Compulsory to attend Long Study Tour by every student for all four years & it is compulsory to submit tour report by the students.
15. There will be submission of dissertation for the Eighth Semester Students of Painting & Sculpture and Applied Art. There will be option for the students of eighth semester

(Applied Art) to select any one of the elective (Graphic Design, Lettering Typography & Calligraphy, Illustration and Photography) for an Advertising campaign as a specialized subject in Practical – I. That will be mentioned in the mark list of Eighth Semester.

16. Students of B.F.A. Applied Art Eighth semester should mention their elective subject as specialization in the university examination form.
17. In Personality Development Course more weightage will be given to English conversation, physical fitness, social values, group discussion, team work, marketing skills, and crisis management & personnel values.
